Legislative Report



The House and Senate adjourned June 1, ending the 84th legislative session. The following are brief summaries of some key bills. Note: Bills without specific dates became law August 31.

TASA 84th Legislative Session: What Passed, What Didn't

BILLS RELATED TO SPECIAL EDUCATION THAT PASSED:

HB 440 Gonzales, Larry(R) Relating to adapting the public school physical Watson, Kirk(D) education curriculum to accommodate the needs of students with mental disabilities. Remarks: Will require accommodations in physical education classes for all student receiving special education services, including those with a mental illness, intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), and autism spectrum disorder.

SB 107 Whitmire, John(D) Relating to the removal, Thompson, Senfronia(D) discipline, or transfer of a public school student. Remarks: Will make the removal of student from campus to another location or to a disciplinary alternative education program discretionary, not mandatory, and requires consideration of whether the student has a disability that affects understanding of code of conduct violations.

SB 149 Seliger, Kel(R) Relating to the creation of individual Huberty, Dan(R) graduation committees for certain high school students. Remarks: Will allow graduation committees to assess whether a student who has not performed satisfactorily on end-of course assessments can qualify for graduation based on other criteria. Does not affect the role of the ARD as final decision maker for students receiving special education services.

SB 507 Lucio, Eddie(D) Relating to the placement of video Thompson, Senfronia(D) cameras in self-contained classrooms providing special education services. Remarks: Will require a school district or open enrollment charter school to provide video camera for self contained classrooms or other special education settings on request of a parent or a school trustee/staff. Parental notification is required, parental consent is not required, and language providing for removal of cameras in response to parental objections was not adopted. Provides that excess Foundation School funds may be used for grants to purchase equipment, with priority given to certain districts.

SB 674 Campbell, Donna(R) Relating to instruction regarding mental health, Coleman, Garnet(D) substance abuse, and youth suicide in educator training programs. Remarks: Will change educator academic requirements from detection of to instruction in mental health, substance abuse, suicide from a list of best practices, including de-escalation and positive behavioral interventions and supports.

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Legislative Report (continued)

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SB 836 Watson, Kirk(D) Rodriguez, Eddie(D) **Relating to management services for the physical facilities of the Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired and the Texas School for the Deaf. Remarks**: Will transfer responsibilities for physical maintenance of Texas School for the Blind and Texas School for the Deaf to the Texas Facilities Commission.

SB 1259 Rodriguez, Jose(D) Relating to the committee developing a student's Allen, Alma(D) individualized education plan, the written report of the committee, and a regular education teacher's opportunity for input. Remarks: Will require general education teacher on IEP to be one of the student's teachers and to provide input into IEP; will require the ARD report to document decisions and include dates, names, positions, and signatures of members, with parent, student if adult, and administrator's agreement or disagreement with decisions noted; members of committee disagreeing will be provided opportunity for statement to be included in report.

SB 1867 Zaffirini, Judith(D) Relating to excluding certain adult students receiving Aycock, Jimmie Don(R) special education services from computation of dropout and completion rates for purposes of public school accountability. Remarks: Will exclude enrolled students receiving special education services from computation of dropout and completion rates if they are 18 or older and have satisfied credit requirements for graduation and have not completed their IEP.

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TPED Registry Exam Information for 2016

TPED is pleased to provide three dates in 2016 for the exam administration in order to accommodate educational diagnosticians across the state. The TPED Registry Exam will be offered April 30, 2016 at Lubbock, June 6, 2016 at Lewisville, and June 18, 2016 at Houston.

The Application, Exam locations and times can be found at www.regped.com. The current Registry Exam study guide will be forwarded upon registration for the exam.

The exam reflects the CEC and SBEC standards. In addition, questions regarding assessment will refer to the revised WISC V and WJ IV.

SBEC Standards

Educational Diagnostician Standard I: The educational diagnostician understands and applies knowledge of the purpose, philosophy and legal foundations of evaluation and special education.

Educational Diagnostician Standard II: The educational diagnostician understands and applies knowledge of ethical and practices, roles and responsibilities.

Educational Diagnostician Standard III: The educational diagnostician develops collaborative relationships with families, educators, the school, the community, outside agencies and related personnel.

Educational Diagnostician Standard IV: The educational diagnostician understands and applies knowledge of student assessment and evaluation, program planning and instructional decision making.

Educational Diagnostician Standard V: The educational diagnostician knows eligibility criteria and procedures for students with disabilities and determining the presence of a need

Educational Diagnostician Standard VI: The educational diagnostician selects, administers and interprets appropriate formal and informal assessments and evaluations.

Educational Diagnostician Standard VII: The educational diagnostician understands and applies knowledge of ethnic, linguistic, cultural and socioeconomic diversity and the significance of student diversity for evaluation, planning and instruction.

Educational Diagnostician Standard VIII: The educational diagnostician knows and demonstrates skills necessary for scheduling, time management and organization.

Educational Diagnostician Standard IX: The educational diagnostician addresses students' behavioral and social interaction skills through appropriate assessment, evaluation, planning and strategies.

Educational Diagnostician Standard X: The educational diagnostician knows and understands appropriate curricula and instructional strategies for individuals with disabilities.
